In the first half of the tenth century, successive members of the Cerdic dynasty established a loose domination over the other great potentates in Britain. In this volume, George Molyneux places the formation of the English kingdom in a European perspective, and challenges the notion that its development was exceptional: the Cerdicings were only one of several ruling dynasties around the fringes of the former Carolingian Empire for which the late ninth, tenth, and eleventh centuries were a time of territorial expansion and consolidation.
