Traum von einer neuen Erde - Bilanz eines theologischen Lebens Leonardo Boff.2019-07 'Ich habe einen Traum ...' Diese Worte aus der berühmten Rede, die Martin Luther King (1929–1968) kurz vor seinem Tod gehalten hat, kommen mir nun in den Sinn, da ich über achtzig Jahre alt und seit mehr als fünfzig Jahren Theologe bin. Ich blicke nun auf meine Zeit als Theologe zurück, die ich in diesem kleinen Buch darstellen will, doch meine Gedanken sind bei den jungen Leuten und mein Geist ist der Ewigkeit zugewandt. So beginnt Leonardo Boff selbst diese kleine Bilanz seines Lebens und Wirkens als Theologe. Seine Beiträge zur Systematischen Theologie, zur Trinitätslehre, zur Christologie, zur Pneumatologie und zur Ekklesiologie, waren teilweise heftig umstritten, aber immer höchst fruchtbar und anregend. Boffs Verdienst ist es aber vor allem, die Befreiungstheologie konsequent zu einer Ökonomie der Befreiung weiterentwickelt zu haben. Im Gespräch mit der neuen Kosmologie, der Quantenphysik, der Tiefenökologie, etc. entfaltet er hier ein neues Paradigma für die Theologie auf der Höhe der Zeit. Diese kleine Summe von Boffs theologischem Denken ist zugleich eine zutiefst spirituelle Lektüre.

Erzählen ist Macht Tobias Lambrecht.2009-07-01 Die vorliegende literaturwissenschaftliche Arbeit beschäftigt sich anhand der drei Romane *Fette Welt*, *Melodien* und *Thanatos* mit dem poetologischen Konzept und den erzählerischen Strategien des Autors Helmut Krausser. Eine konzise Einführung der narratologischen Grundbegriffe bildet die methodische Grundlage. Diskutiert wird die These, dass die realitätskonstituierende Kraft des Erzählprozesses durch die Verwendung von metafictionalen Elementen in den Romanen zunehmend prominenter und expliziter gemacht wird. But then Schlump is sent to the front, and the good times end. *Schlump*, written by Hans Herbert Grimm, was published anonymously in 1928 and was one of the first German novels to describe World War I in all its horror and absurdity, and it remains one of the best. What really sets it apart is its remarkable central character. Who is Schlump? A bit of a rascal and a bit of a sweetheart, a victim of his times, an inveterate survivor, maybe even a new type of man. At once comedy, documentary, hellhole, and fairy tale, *Schlump* is a gripping and disturbing book about the experience of trauma and what the great critic Walter Benjamin, writing at the same time as Hans Herbert Grimm, would call the death of experience, since perhaps if anything goes, nothing counts.
