While most equivalent studies aim to define national cinema as independent from or in competition with Hollywood, this collection explores a more porous set of relationships through the varied production, distribution and exhibition associations between Australia and the US. To explore this idea, the book investigates the influence that Australia has had on US cinema through the exportation of its stars, directors and other production personnel to Hollywood, while also charting the sustained influence of US cinema on Australia over the last hundred years. Although this concentration on US production, or influence, is particularly acute in relation to developments such as the opening of international film studios in Melbourne, Sydney, Adelaide and the Gold Coast over the last thirty years, the book also examines a range of Hollywood financed and/or conceived films shot in Australia since the 1920s.

City Stages Michael McKinnie. 2013-06-17 In every major city, there exists a complex exchange between urban space and the institution of the theatre. *City Stages* is an interdisciplinary and materialist analysis of this relationship as it has existed in Toronto since 1967. The result is a comprehensive and empirical examination of the relationship between the

theatrical arts and the urban spaces that house them.

Dr. Vanessa Theme Ament is the author of *The Foley Grail*, and a contributor to *Sound: Dialogue, Music, and Effects* (the Silver Screen Series). She is on the steering committee for Cinesonika, an international film festival and conference. A veteran Foley artist, sound editor, and voice actor from Los Angeles, she also writes and sings jazz, and is a member of the American Federation of Musicians, SAG-AFTRA, Actors Equity, and the Editors Guild. She worked on *Die Hard*, *sex, lies, and videotape*, *Platoon*, *Predator*, *Edward Scissorhands*, *Beauty and the Beast*, *Noises Off*, and *A Goofy Movie*, and many other films. This philological approach to the (pre)history of cinema engages both old media such as scrolls, illuminated manuscripts, the Bayeux Tapestry, and new digital media such as DVDs, HD DVDs, and computers. Burt examines the uncanny repetitions that now fragment films into successively released alternate cuts and extras (footnote tracks, audiocommentaries, and documentaries) that (re)structure and reframe historical films, thereby presenting new

challenges to historicist criticism and film theory. With a double focus on recursive narrative frames and the cinematic paratexts of medieval and early modern film, this book calls our attention to strange, sometimes opaque phenomena in film and literary theory that have previously gone unrecognized.
